

- D91 is committed to increasing student achievement through the use of Professional Learning Communities and implementation of Marzano's High Reliability School framework.
- D91 encourages an innovative approach to learning with a STEM elementary school, an English Learning Education elementary school and a magnet high school, which is part of the New Tech Network.
- With recent investments in technology, D91 is now a 1-to-1 district with a focus on integrating technology into day-to-day instruction.
- D91 strives to provide advanced opportunities to all ages with a K-8 Gifted and Talented Program, AP and Dual Enrollment classes in the high schools, and partnerships with local colleges and universities for early college and concurrent classes. Our students earned more than 3,000 dual credit college credits last year.
- D91 students perform better on the SAT than the state average, and a higher percentage of

- our students meet both SAT College and Career Readiness Benchmarks than the state average.
- D91 offers a robust and award-winning Career Technical Education program with an emphasis on medical professions, culinary arts, business and finance, construction, and auto tech.
- D91 promotes the arts with thriving music programs, including choir, band, and orchestra, as well as fine art and drama programs, which include the annual district musical.
- D91 promotes athletic competition, fielding teams in all IHSAA sports and is proud of its academic and athletic district and/or state champions.
- Over the last 10 years, D91 has made significant improvements to its facilities including the construction of four new elementary schools to replace aged buildings and other major renovation projects.
