- 4. Monitor and make recommendations for the annual revision of the Strategic Plan
- 5. Be responsible for recommending to the Board of Trustees, for its adoption, all courses of study, curriculum guides, and major changes in texts and time schedules to be used in the schools
- 6. Ensure the implementation and evaluation of all Board-approved written curriculum for all subjects, and ensure the inclusion of mandated programs and state core curriculum content standards
- 7. Provide leadership and guidance in the processes of curriculum planning, coordination, and evaluation. Provide for curriculum articulation among grades and schools in the district
- 8. Encourage staffs to develop programs, services, and projects that provide instructional alternatives and flexibility while assuring a consistent education for all students
- 9. Ensure the effectiveness of the instructional program by measuring student achievement against state and local standards
- 10. Initiate program changes as necessary
- 11. Review with staff all curriculum guides and courses of study as directed by the Board
- 12. Seek out available sources for grant funding to support programs and projects
- 13. Develop and oversee the delivery of the district's intervention services for pupils who are experiencing difficulties in their classes
- 14. Implement a Board-approved program of guidance and counseling services
